## The Purdue Horticultural Center



The [March Garden](#) calendar from Purdue suggests

Watch for **blooms of early spring bulbs**, such as daffodils, squill, crocus, dwarf iris, and snowdrops.

**Start the seeds of warm-season vegetables** and flowers indoors. In central Indiana, wait until the end of March or early April . You will be able to transplant outside in mid-May.

**Do not work the soil outside while it is wet** – wait until it crumbles in your hand. If the soil forms a solid ball when you squeeze it, it's too wet.

**Plant new trees and shrubs as soon as the soil dries** enough to be worked. Plant bare-root plants before they leaf out.

**Fertilize woody plants** before new growth begins, but after soil temperatures reach 40°F.

**Remove winter coverings from roses** as soon as new growth begins. Prune out dead canes and fertilize as needed. Delay pruning into live canes until after you can assess winter injury.

Apply **superior oil spray to control scale insects** and mites when the tips of leaves start to protrude from buds.

**Remove old foliage** from ornamental grasses and perennial flowers.

**Plan to plant cool-season vegetables and flowers** as soon as the ground has dried enough to work. Gradually harden-off transplants by setting them outdoors during the daytime for about a week before planting.
