
PCN News delivery by email, website

Early risers on Jan. 31 will see partial eclipse of a super, "blue moon"



The Blue Moon - second of two full moons in one calendar month - will pass through the Earth's shadow on January 31, 2018, to give us a lunar eclipse. In Carmel, we will **see the very beginnings of the eclipse around 6 a.m.**, as the moon passes into the penumbra. While slipping into the Earth's shadow, the moon will also be setting, so look to the west. Around 6:45, the moon will start getting red. We will not see the total lunar eclipse but even a bit of this astral phenomenon can be awe-inspiring.

The January 31 full moon is also the third in a series of three straight full moon supermoons - that is, super-close full moons. It's the first of two Blue Moons in 2018. The next Blue Moon will be March 31, 2018.

Words of Winter Weather Wisdom



January has historically be the coldest month in Indiana, with average temperatures between a low of 20° and a high of 36°. While it is hard to imagine anything colder than the first week of January, it is still important to be prepared. Risks include power loss, getting stuck, and injuries.

In case of **power loss**, have at least a three-day supply of water, medicines, and foods that do not need to be cooked at your home. Keep numbers handy to reach friends or family if it turns out you need another place to stay.

Make sure you are prepared **in case you get stuck**. Keep a blanket, some nonperishable food, water, and jumper cables in your car. Add a small shovel, if you can. Keep your cell phone charged, so you can make emergency calls.

To **prevent injury**, keep your walkways and sidewalks shoveled. In fact, the City of Carmel expects residents to shovel the sidewalk within a few days of fresh snowfall. Use de-icing products as needed. If you need help shoveling, look on NextDoor or ask neighbors for tips or referrals.
