Neighborhood Park Clean-Up



Prairie Meadow Park is supposed to be a grassy meadow but it has been invaded in recent years by Callery/Bradford pear, honeysuckle, and autumn olive. Each is considered undesirable because it self-sows rampantly and replaces native species.

Carmel Parks has trained some PCN residents and Delaware Trace residents in how to **remove these small trees and bushes**. Join us at Prairie Meadow Park on Ivy Hill with your loppers, bow saw, and gloves on **Saturday, May 18 from 9 a.m. until you quit--or noon, whichever comes first**. Appropriate for families, as we also will move the brush to the side. There will be a computer tablet onsite for you to use to sign in electronically as a parks volunteer.
