Did You Know?

In case of a fire, it is not only crucial to have a working smoke alarm in your home, but it is also the law (IC 22-11-18-3.5). Working smoke alarms can double the chances of surviving a residence fire.

By Indiana law, all dwellings must have at least one functioning smoke alarm installed outside each sleeping area, and on each level of the building.

Winter safety for our Furry Friends

As the weather gets colder and holidays abound, here are a few safety tips to keep in mind for your favorite pets:

- * Keep those paws clean! The salt and other material used to melt the ice can be irritating to their paws and make them sick if they eat it.
- * Keep all antifreeze away from pets it will cause life-threatening kidney failure if they lick even a small amount.
- * If they live outside make sure that there is good shelter available... a warm, covered area layered with clean straw is needed. Fresh water should be easily accessible.
- * Do not feed leftovers or food from the kitchen table the rich "people" food can lead to a serious illness called pancreatitis and some foods like chocolate, grapes and raisins can cause toxicity in dogs and cats.

State Fire Marshall issues Safety Reminder

STATE FIRE MARSHAL REMINDS HOOSIERS TO USE SPACE HEATERS, FIREPLACES AND OTHER ALTERNATIVE HEATING EQUIPMENT RESPONSIBLY

"Every winter, firefighters across the state respond to thousands of home fires caused by heating equipment," said Indiana State Fire Marshal Jim Greeson. "These types of fires can almost always be prevented by homeowners and renters who use alternative heat sources carefully and responsibly."

Woodstoves or fireplaces:

- Use only dry, seasoned wood in a fireplace or woodstove to avoid the build-up of creosote, an oily deposit that easily catches fire.
- Use only paper or kindling wood, not a flammable liquid, to start the fire.
- Do not use artificial logs in woodstoves.
- Make sure your fireplace has a sturdy screen to prevent sparks from flying into the room.
- Allow fireplace and woodstove ashes to cool before disposing in a metal container, which is kept a safe distance from your home.
