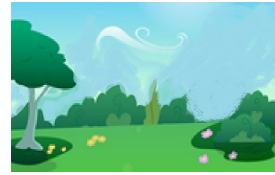


YOUR BOARD IN ACTION

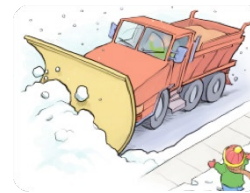

Lunar New Year

The Lunar New Year goes by many different names, including: Chinese New Year, Chinese Chunjie, Vietnamese Tet, Korean Solnal, Tibetan Losar, and Spring Festival.

What is the Lunar New Year? A festival that begins with the first new moon of the lunar calendar and ends on the first full moon of the lunar calendar, 15 days later.

Who celebrates it? Typically people from China and other Asian countries.

When is it? It begins February 5th, 2019

What year is it? Each lunar year is associated with an animal. This year is the year of the pig or boar.



Are there any customs / traditions? Yes!

- 1) “Sweeping the grounds” – Houses are thoroughly cleaned to remove any bad luck that may be lingering inside.
- 2) Red envelopes (lai see) – Monetary gift given from and to family members.
- 3) Lots of dancing and fireworks.
- 4) The Lantern Festival – Celebrated on the last day of the New Year’s celebrations. This festival honors deceased ancestors.
